




Release 27.0.2 Notes – Version 2

The *PostalOne!* Release 27.0.2 will deploy on August 28, 2011 to introduce software upgrades to the system, correcting issues that have been identified.

These pre-Release Notes provide the expected contents of these releases and its effect on the following areas. The information in this document is subject to change.

1. Mailers (External)

PostalOne! Releases 27.0.2 will be deployed on August 28, 2011 to introduce software upgrades to the system. Those upgrades include corrections to issues previously identified from previous releases.

The following items are of interest to external users of the *PostalOne!* system. These are pre-release notes and all information in this document is subject to change.

1.1 Domestic Postage Processing

Change Reply Rides Free from 1.2 oz to 2 oz. Currently for Reply Rides Free, the system checks the weight of a single piece entered on the Permit Entry page for a maximum value of 1.2 oz (0.075 lbs). Effective Sept 1, 2011, this will be changed to 2 oz (0.125 lbs). All other rules apply --a reply mail piece has to be included to be eligible--and all other aspects of the program, including volume thresholds, must be met to participate. [79696, 80251, 80346]

1.2 Mail.dat Validations

Error message text will be updated to indicate that the .csm file is required for all update/change jobs. [72768]

For 3.5oz First Class Mail, Automation Letters were Failing Client Validation (Error 4047), when the weight is rounded to 0.21875 lbs (3.500 oz). The change allows letters weighing 0.21875 lbs lb and rounded to 0.2188 in the Mail.dat file to qualify as 3.5 oz letters. It is required to download the new Mail.dat client for this correction. To avoid this rounding rule do not download the new Mail.dat client. The Mail.dat client has no other change for this release. [75236]

Containers allocated to virtual sacks were mapped to sack/tray lines on the PS Form 3541 for Outside County Periodical container charges. The change will map the parent pallet for the virtual sacks to the pallet line. [80130]

Duplicate postage was charged to two lines on PS Form 3600 FCM: line B5 (Single-Piece from Standard Mail Mailing for letters) and line B8 (Single-Piece from Standard Mail Mailing for nonmachinable letters) for First-Class Mail Nonautomation pieces. The change will correctly charge the pieces to line B5 only. [80123]

1.3 Mail.XML Postage Statement Processing

The Mail.XML PostageStatementCreateRequest or PeriodicalsPostageCreateRequest submitted with Move Update Method '8' - 'OneCode ACS' will populate the postage statement with OneCode ACS instead of not declared. [74995]

1.4 Mail.dat Postage Statement Processing

The Mail.dat file submitted with Move Update Method '8' - 'OneCode ACS' will populate the postage statement with OneCode ACS instead of not declared. [74995]

Additional Postage Permit Number/Type is added as a key Postage Statement generation field. [80175].

For Periodicals Outside County bundle charges, bundles will be counted by unique Container ID and Package ID. [80247, 78836]

1.5 Mail.dat Reports

For all classes of mail, in the qualification report, bundles will be defined by the unique Container ID and Package ID. [80247, 78836]

1.6 Periodicals

1.6.1 Statement of Ownership

A correction will be implemented to Statement of Ownership processing so that all data is saved. [80180]

1.7 NonProfit Authorization Records

For Nonprofit authorization records, the alternate address field will accept either street addresses or PO Box addresses. [80220, 80208]
