



Release Notes 41.1.2.0

The *PostalOne!* system Release 41.1.2.0 is scheduled to be deployed June 30, 2015 to introduce software fixes to the system. This includes corrections to issues previously identified in a prior release.

These Release Notes provide the contents of the release and affected subsystems.

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1. External Trouble Reports (ETRs) and Engineering Change Requests (ECRs)

1.1 Dashboard

- Clearance placards can now be successfully printed for postage statements accessed through the *PostalOne!* Dashboard that do not require sampling. Prior to this release, users received a JavaScript error when they clicked Print Placard on the Print Clearance Placard page for a postage statement that did not require sampling. [7489 {B}](#)
- The *PostalOne!* System has been updated to enable consistent finalization of Mail Anywhere postage statements using Metered (MT) or Precanceled Stamp (PC) permits when additional postage is due. Prior to this release, users received an error when they attempted to finalize an MT or PC Mail Anywhere postage statement when the additional postage was paid by a permit linked to a Centralized Account Processing System (CAPS) account. The error was generated when the finance number of the permit used for additional postage did not match the finance number of the MT or PC permit on the Mail Anywhere postage statement. Users are now prompted to use the Permit Search function to select the permit to be used for additional postage in order to eliminate the possibility of an invalid entry. [7463 {B}](#)

1.2 eInduction

- eInduction invoice finalization batch processing has received a performance improvement with this release. [7248 {B}](#)
- eInduction is now properly notified of the new mailing date when a postage statement's mailing date is updated through the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) Update Mailing Date option. Previously, the updated mailing date was not communicated to eInduction if a postage statement's mailing date was updated in this way. This left open the possibility that containers on the postage statement could have an incorrect invoice period if the updated mailing date crossed the previous invoice period, or if the container had a validation error that was greater than the error tolerance threshold. - An issue has been corrected that previously resulted in an incorrect invoicing assessment for mailings that prompted a non-numeric zone validation ("E13P"). The Entry Point Discount (EPD) invoice assessment was incorrectly generated instead of the zone invoicing assessment for E13P. As a result of the issue, the Mailer Scorecard eInduction tab displayed an incorrect metric for Postage Assessment. [7541 {B}](#)
- The eInduction Quick Status Report has been updated to display the correct container status for all containers. Prior to this release, some containers were incorrectly displayed as being not expected or rejected without having an actual scan date and time. The issue only impacted jobs with eInduction containers where the eDoc was created but had not yet been scanned. As a workaround, the eInduction status could be viewed by searching the Shipping Summary Report by Job ID. [7419 {E}](#)

1.3 Electronic Verification System (eVS®)

- eVS presort validation has been updated to correctly handle postage adjustments for First-Class Mixed ADC mailpieces that fail the validation. The eVS presort validation process includes Mixed ADC mailpieces for the purpose of qualifying them for presorted rates. However, since the protocol for non-qualifying pieces is to charge them using the single-piece rate, the net postage adjustment is \$0.00. This is because the single-piece rate is the same as the Mixed ADC rate. This is shown on the Presort Eligibility Exception Report (PEER). Prior to this release, the postage adjustment was incorrectly calculated at the full value for the non-qualifying mailpieces, which resulted in an overpayment by the mailer. As a workaround, the reviewing clerk could drop the pieces from the adjustment. [7486 {B}](#)
- eVS processing has been updated to properly apply contract pricing for Parcel Select Next Day Destination Service Center Facility (DSCF) mailpieces to extended delivery area ZIP Codes (i.e., rural ZIP Codes). Previously, a change implemented in the May 2015 *PostalOne!* Release to support contract rates for rural ZIP Codes on DSCF Parcel Select statements inadvertently introduced a defect affecting Parcel Select Next Day statements. The issue prevented the contract rate from being applied for the Parcel Select Next Day statements with rural ZIP Code destinations. [7501 {B}](#)
- eVS has been updated to correctly apply the custom rate on postage statements for mailers who have a custom contract for the Signature Confirmation extra service. Prior to this release, postage statements for some eVS mailers with a custom contracted rate for Signature Confirmation received the published rate instead of the custom contract rate for that extra service. 1.4 Performance-Based Verification (PBV)

- PBV processing has been updated to properly account for the scenario where an electronically-submitted postage statement (eDoc) submitter has a Customer Registration ID (CRID) that doesn't match the Mail Anywhere CRID. Prior to this release, PBV incorrectly used the history attributed to the Mail Anywhere CRID for verification assessment instead of using the eDoc submitter CRID as it should have in cases where the two did not match. As a result of the issue, some mailers were incorrectly categorized as new mailers (since no verification history existed for the Mail Anywhere CRID) and erroneously prompted for all verifications. 1.5 Periodicals

Postage statements for Mail.dat Periodicals jobs with Outside-County Bundles now properly reflect the postage for all bundle lines. Previously, some bundle lines on Mail.dat Periodicals statements were incorrectly displayed with 4 decimal places instead of being rounded to 2 places as they should have been. This was a display issue only and did not affect postage calculation. The Outside-County Bundle postage was charged correctly on the affected statements (PS Form 3541). [6517 {B}](#)

1.6 Postage Statement Processing

- The *PostalOne!* system has been updated to enable Official Mail Accounting System (OMAS) Metered (OM) accounts to be used for combined First-Class or combined Standard Mail postage statement entry. OMAS accounts are able to be used in the same way as commercial accounts of the corresponding type (e.g., an OM permit account has the same capabilities as a Metered (MT) permit account). Previously, a defect incorrectly restricted users from using an OM permit account for entry of a combined First-Class or Standard Mail postage statement. Users received the error "Postage Due permit account and an affixed amount for a postage affixed child statement are required" when attempting to enter a combined statement with using an OM permit, and were unable to proceed with statement entry. The issue occurred when a user selected First-Class Combined or Standard Mail Combined postage statement entry, and then proceeded to the Master Statement entry page, where they entered an OM account as the Account Holder. The required Postage Due Account fields were disabled, and the error message was displayed when the user clicked Continue following entry of the Mailing Agent CRID and Processing Category. - Prices for Restricted Delivery extra services lines S30 (Registered Mail Restricted Delivery), S31 (Insurance Restricted Delivery), and S32 (COD Restricted Delivery) are now consistently reflected on First-Class Mail postage statements submitted via Mail.dat (V15-1) when viewed on the postage statement review page. Prior to this release, some First-Class Mail postage statements failed to display prices for Extra Services and Fees lines S30, S31, and S32, and instead reflected the price as \$0.00 for those lines. - The Postage Assessment Module (PAM) has been updated to add Extra Services "Fragile" and "Hazardous Material" to the module per DMM 507.1.5.4 for mail that is Undeliverable As Addressed (UAA). [7465 {B}](#)
- PAM has been updated to reinstate single-piece pricing for Library Mail, Media Mail, Bound Printed Matter (BPM), Standard Post, and First-Class Mail Parcels per DMM 507.1.5.4. A prior *PostalOne!* System release inadvertently removed this functionality. [7432 {B}](#)
- The Entry Point Container Detail page Container List Report has been updated to properly display physical sibling containers belonging to the logical containers referenced by the Container ID(s). Previously, a data retrieval defect prevented physical containers from being displayed on the Container List Report, and incorrectly displayed only logical containers instead. [3116 {E}](#)
- Postage statement processing has been updated to enable First-Class Mail postage statements to auto-finalize in scenarios where the Customer Registration ID (CRID) of the eDoc submitter is linked to a permit with paid fees. This is an addition to the existing auto-finalization rules, which enable auto-finalization when one of the following scenarios is true. [7516 {E}](#)
 - o The permit holder fee is paid.
 - o The permit holder has an active fee waiver.
 - o The mailing contains no presort mailpieces.
 - o The eDoc submitter (as determined by CRID) has a permit with an active fee waiver (First-Class Mail only).
 - o [New] The eDoc submitter (as determined by CRID) has a permit with fees paid (First-Class Mail only).

1.7 Return Services

Support for retail pricing of First-Class Mail Parcels weighing 1-13 oz. has been reinstated for Return Services in both the Postage Assessment Module (PAM) and non-PAM processes. A prior *PostalOne!* System release inadvertently removed this support. [7422 {B}](#), [7423 {B}](#)

1.8 Scan-Based Payment (SBP)

- An issue has been corrected which previously resulted in some permits being incorrectly linked to a Mailer ID (MID) in rare instances. The defect occurred in a case where two companies had separate SBP profiles but the associated MIDs were incorrectly linked to the same profile. [7471 {B}](#)
- The SBP Intelligent Mail Device (IMD) process has been updated to correct an index offset issue that occurred when parsing detail records for IMD Version 4. Previously, IMD samples were unable to be processed and the data was rejected due to the parsing defect. [7523 {B}](#)
