Key Discussion Points

Action Items

- eInduction Team will review the July *PostalOne!* release notes for information surrounding the locale key inputs
- eInduction Team will determine volume of First-Class Mail being listed as ORIGIN
- eInduction Team will work with Seamless Team to validate the ability to use ORIGIN as the locale key
- eInduction Team will determine the process regarding First-Class Mail going to different locations when input as a logical record
- eInduction Team will validate that phasing out the use of ORIGIN would not impact other systems

Questions/Comments

- Does the locale key listed need to be for the plant or the DMU?
 - The locale key needs to be for the plant where the mail will be inducted.
 - If ORIGIN is input in place of the locale key, the container will scan as Not Expected.
- Does Seamless allow the use of ORIGIN in place of the locale key?
 - Seamless has a front-end validation that does not allow mailers to use ORIGIN in place of the locale key.
- If an origin container is not marked for eInduction are paper forms still needed?
 - Yes, if a container is not marked eInduction then a PS Form 8125 or PS Form 8017 will continue to be required.
- When will default 3rd party invoicing be in place?
 - January 2014 at the earliest.

- Until the SV site indicator in the MDF is accurate, the SV Site List on RIBBS will be updated quarterly or in conjunction with the MDF.
- The group reacted negatively to the proposed option of allowing 3rd parties to update a container to Mis-Shipped Accept. The group felt that allowing a 3rd party to drop mail at a location other than the one expected by the mailer was encroaching on the relationship between mailers and logistics companies.
