Roll Call + Review Minutes from Previous Meeting

eInduction Status

- **Process Compliance Issues**
 - **Q:** What documentation would be applicable to appeal a duplicate scan error?
 - **A:** USPS will review and provide at a later date in conjunction with other invoicing dispute criteria

Onboarding and Adoption

IM-DAS Solution Update

- Pilot September - October to ensure all functionality is as expected before national deployment
- **Q:** Would it be possible to put IM-DAS scanners at origin facilities that are not plants?
 - **A:** Yes, this pilot will impact DDUs as USPS works toward same process at all facilities and will impact **all non-SV** locations
- Phase 3 of network consolidation has been announced
 - Some SV sites are closing and the eInduction Team is in the process of determining if the hardware will be moved to a new location
 - Per SV Team there is no plan to expand SV at this time
- Pilot entry locations have not yet been determined
- Beginning January 2015, eInduction will be updated to begin having all locations – SV and non-SV – to have post-induction validations
 - Decision-making on the dock will no longer occur at SV locations

Invoicing

- **Q:** After the Shipping Summary Report upgrade will it still be possible to generate the report by date range?
 - **A:** Yes, the date prompt will still be there
 - **Q:** Will any other prompts be required?
 - **A:** As designed, no, but USPS will confirm with CAT testers

Action Items

- Information alignment error:
 - A result of conversation in Steve Dearing's Service Performance Measurement focus group
 - He shared different information regarding scan accuracy and level of visibility
 - eInduction scan compliance is based on Full-Service containers that have pieces scanned within a facility
 - Able to ensure that contents made it into USPS so the container must have arrived
 - SV and SPM scan compliance is based on:
 - Mailer shipments:
 - Use data from FAST to determine expected scan rates
 - This is not used by eInduction because the confidence level is not high
 - Unable to hold the facility accountable based on this information
 - Corporate level:
 - SV and SPM have a greater focus on parcels
 - Able to use more USPS internal scans rather than the drop ship scan
 - **AXN:** USPS will continue to follow-up with SV Team
