- AEC I/II
 - NPF Session / Panel
There will be an AEC I/II at NPF. Will likely be a panel of 3, hosted by Angela or Earl, and featuring a mail owner and possibly a mail service provider/vendor.
 - AEC Questions? Please forward to Earl.

- November MTAC overview (**Kim**)
 - Megan Brennan introduced her initial goals as PMG: improve service, improve efficiencies, improve operations. The innovation opportunities are with the first mile, the network, the last mile, and online.
 - Secure Destruction is now live. Mailer MID must be registered for the service, EPF and ACS. Still First-Class letters only. STIDs still haven't been published. Secure Destruction scans will only be available through EPF.
 - Move assessments:
 - Move assessments have been deferred to July. From the measured data, only 0.4% are in error, so the 0.8% threshold is generous. There should be a federal register posted soon. Assessments will be effective for First-Class, Periodicals and Standard Mail.
 - Periodicals will be getting more ACS data with Full-Service. Will be fulfilling all ACS data to Periodicals as soon as January 1.
 - Eventually assessments could apply to CASS and Basic IMb pieces once details are worked out.
 - Current reports only show the first 100 errors. Mailers can request more data from the helpdesk.
 - There were some questions about how Legal Restraint and the 99% rule would be enforced – might be from the Mail Owner CRID.
 - There are also questions about why the eDoc submitter gets the invoice – a big list of suggestions were noted by a WG, but would require extensive development.
 - The 2014 UAA study should be posted in December.
 - OIG NCOALink audit:
 - The secure hash algorithm used today (SHA1) isn't acceptable. USPS is evaluating other algorithms (SHA2 and SHA3) to find a suitable alternative. A few years back SHA1 was cracked, so federal agencies are moving away from it. The plan is to roll this out with a CASS Cycle/PIT meeting, etc.

- Jan 25 is still the date for the ACS changes, this is not tied to the PostalOne release.
- Periodicals ACS changes are starting next week in Tampa, rolling out through January for all ACS.
